

Prescot Festival Celebrates Annual Music Sunday

A Merseyside arts festival will hold three special events as participants in the Royal School of Church Music's annual Music Sunday.

Prescot Festival will be marking the occasion with an organ recital, choral Evensong and Last Night of the Proms-style concert.

Timothy Noon, Director of Music at Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King, will perform a programme of sacred and secular organ works. This will be followed by choral Evensong which sees the world premier performance of The Prescot Setting (Howard in D) of the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis. This work has been written especially for Music Sunday by Festival Director, Dr Robert Howard.

To coincide with the conclusion of the Prescot Festival, Liverpool Male Voice Choir, in their 100th year, will lead a Proms-style concert to include traditional patriotic songs including Jerusalem, Rule Britannia, & Land of Hope & Glory.

Among other events in the 10-day Prescot Festival will be an opening night barn dance, a come-&-sing performance of Haydn's *Creation* (excerpts), new music concert with world premier of Journey, also by Robert Howard, and a concert by L'Orchestra Dell'Arte. Modern chamber music, songs from the shows, contemporary acoustic music and a brass band will all be on this year's packed programme.

The Prescot Festival of Music & the Arts was founded by composer, musician and teacher Dr Robert Howard in 2005 as a way to celebrate Prescot's rich historical and cultural heritage.

Lindsay Gray, Director of the RSCM, says: "Music Sunday is a celebration of all music in Christian worship, whether it is hymns, worship songs, instrumental or choral singing. It's also a celebration of the music-makers, both amateur and professional, who contribute so much to the life of their church. I want to thank Prescot Festival for joining Music Sunday 2011 and I wish them the very best."
